A Message from Jewish Care Scotland

"It's all go at Jewish Care Scotland! As lockdown slowly begins to ease, we are finding our way towards a "new normal". We have been working on making our offices at the Walton Community Care Centre safe, so that our staff can return. As of July 13^{th,} 2020 our Day Centre staff (equipped with all the proper PPE) will be able to make home visits, to ensure that everyone who needs a helping hand has the support that they need. It's so exciting to know that we will get to see some of you again.

However, while some things will be changing, we do want everyone to know that some things will stay the same. There will be someone available at Jewish Care Scotland to answer the phone if you call us between 9am and 9pm, Mondays to Thursdays, and between 9 am and 3 pm on a Friday; we are still able to assist with shopping for vulnerable people who cannot leave their homes and do not have anyone to help; we are still working with Gary the Kosher Chef to make sure that no one in our community is without a warm kosher meal and we are still here to offer advice and support to anyone experiencing difficulties, including housing issues, benefits problems, anxiety and other mental health problems, or experiencing a family crisis.

We also still have some of Jennifer Watson's lovely home masks available at the Walton Community Care Centre, which are suitable for use on public transport or while out shopping.
